We are fortunate to welcome Chase Strangio (he, him) as this year's keynote speaker. Chase is the ACLU's deputy director for transgender justice and a prominent figure in transgender rights. Noted for his legal victories and influential media appearances, Strangio's work has made him one of *Time* Magazine's 100 most influential people in 2020. Today, he will discuss challenges to trans rights and health before participating in a roundtable discussion with Ohio's trans leaders.

What our keynote speaker has in common with Equitas Health and the Equitas Health Institute is a strong commitment to ending the disparities in healthcare access for LGBTQ+ communities. Anti-LGBTQ+ bills introduced in state legislatures across the country have explicitly targeted the transgender and non-binary communities. School boards want to restrict what students read and which bathrooms they can use. These bills and actions threaten access to life-saving affirming care.

Joy & Resilience celebrates our strength and resolve as we seek to secure and safeguard the health of transgender and genderdiverse people. It honors those who have made a difference in the delivery of care and those who continue to break down barriers. In 1984, a grave new threat knocked on humanity's door. We answered the way humans have throughout history: United and ready to fight. Relatively little was known about HIV/AIDS at the time. But we knew our loved ones in the LGBTQ+ community were getting sick and dying, and we knew the resources in our battle were lacking.

So we gathered in living rooms and around kitchen tables, caring for the sick in any way we could. Soon, this grassroots movement spread across the state and a collective formed. A flicker of hope was ignited. Today, we have a new name, and our mission has grown in scope to providing healthcare for all.

We're still united and even stronger in our collective power. Today, Equitas Health is a nonprofit community healthcare system. We are one of the nation's largest LGBTQ+ and HIV/AIDS-serving organizations, serving tens of thousands of patients in Ohio, Texas, Kentucky, and West Virginia. Our legacy is comprised of the following organizations: AIDS Foundation of Dayton, AIDS Foundation Miami Valley, AIDS Resource Center Ohio, BRAVO, Columbus AIDS Task Force, David's House of Compassion, Dayton Area AIDS Task Force, Metropolitan Residential Services, and Ohio AIDS Coalition.



Keynote Speaker

Chase Strangio (he, him) is the deputy director for transgender justice with the ACLU's LGBTQ & HIV Project and a nationally recognized leader in transgender rights. He has represented the trans community in some of the most pivotal cases to come before courts and state legislatures across the country. He led the ACLU's challenge to North Carolina's notorious "bathroom bill" (HB2) and the case of Aimee Stephens, the first transgender civil rights case heard by the U.S. Supreme Court. Strangio also provided counsel in *Obergefell v. Hodges*, the Supreme Court decision that legalized same-sex marriage nationwide.

Outside the courtroom, Strangio advocates for LGBTQ+ rights in his writing and in the media. He has appeared on *The Rachel Maddow Show*, *PBS NewsHour*, *Democracy Now*, and *Pod Save America*. In 2020, *Time* Magazine named Strangio one of the 100 most influential people of the year. Actress and LGBTQ+ advocate Laverne Cox wrote that Strangio's legal work and activism helped to shape her own activism. "Chase has the fortitude to speak with clarity on the messy contradictions and limitations of our legal system, while simultaneously wielding the powers of that system to help the most vulnerable," wrote Cox.

Strangio is the producer of numerous short films, including the Emmyaward winning, *Trans in America: Texas Strong*. He co-founded the Lorena Borjas Community Fund, TranSanta, and the Trans Week of Visibility & Action. A graduate of Northeastern University School of Law and a Harvard Law School fellow, he has received numerous honors and awards for his work.

The Equitas Health Institute is proud to welcome this dynamic speaker, activist, and advocate to this year's Transforming Care Conference. Strangio will address the challenges to trans rights and health in 2023 with an emphasis on finding joy and resilience in community. He also will join Ohio trans leaders in an afternoon roundtable discussion moderated by Dr. Rhea Debussy (she, her), director of external affairs at Equitas Health.

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
